Gift exchanges included anything from a plant from their garden, fresh organic eggs from their chickens, a hand made craft or a store bought gift. The activity was two days before Mother's Day. The first baby was born right on Mother's Day. A week later, another mother's joy was turned to mourning when her baby died 30 minutes after he was born. The grieving mother called Lisa only minutes after he died following the home-birthing. The father of this impoverished family made a little casket with wood planks they had on hand, then covered it with white lace. The wake was that night and the burial the following day under heavy rains. We spent many hours by their side. We have seen far too many little white caskets since we've been here.

Countless hours and numerous meetings went into the preparation of what turned out to be an action packed week in July! U.S. I.B.L.P. (Institute of Basic Life Principles) Prison Chaplains, Bob Holyfield and Jim Ruehmann, with their wives, Betty and Nancy, stayed with us 10 days. We had never met before but God knit our hearts together in a special way. We worked well as a team. We took seminar sessions by DVD and live to the National Penitentiary System offices 2 days and to two different prisons the other 3 days. Art & Chap. Bob were at the men's prison with over 100 inmates participating. Lisa and the rest of the team were at the women's prison with 150 women participating. The seminar teaches how to resolve conflict. It talks about the importance of asking forgiveness and also forgiving others. It expounds on the root causes of bitterness, anger and resentment, among many other topics. The Spiritual warfare was very strong. Satan did not want us to do these seminars, but the victory had already been won! Many people received inner healing. Quite a number turned their lives over to Christ. By the end of the third day in the prisons, inmates and staff, including guards, openly expressed their gratitude to us for having brought the seminar to them. Various ones shared about how it changed their lives. We give God all the glory! What little time we were not in the prisons or with penitentiary staff, we were sightseeing. It was exhausting, but well worth it!!! Fourty-eight hours after returning to Arkansas, Chaplain Bob Holyfield underwent emergency open-heart surgery.
