


Due to the generosity of two donor families, we were able to complete a housing project. The kitchen of one of the two houses we built last year,



still had a dirt floor and old tin sheets for walls. We were able to build new corrugated tin walls and give them a concrete floor. Before we poured the concrete, one of the donors suddenly passed away. We were able to etch his name into the concrete in his memory.

It doesn't seem possible that in May, we will be completing 19 years in full-time ministry in Guatemala. We made our first trip here over 20 years ago (*picture below*). The last 19 years have been extremely fulfilling. We have been stretched in many ways throughout the years. It has forced us to grow spiritually and emotionally. We have been here long enough now to be working with the second and third generations. We have the privilege of seeing the fruit from work done in our early years.

Questions and Answers

Q. What has been the most challenging part of your ministry through the years? **A.** Probably dealing with so much death. Due to the fact that Guatemala has one of the highest poverty rates in Latin America, we deal with a lot of premature deaths; infancy to young adult. It is so sad!

Q. How are you funded as missionaries? **A.** We are funded by individuals and churches who believe in our ministry. We are only about half funded through donations, the rest comes from our very limited personal funds. It has always been our desire to be fully funded by donations.

Q. Have you bought another car yet? **A.** Not yet. Buying a car in Guatemala is no simple project. We have bought or imported a half a dozen cars over the years we have been here. Not only is it difficult to find what we need, but the paperwork process is much more extensive here than in the states. We are still raising car funds and looking for a car at the same time. The more recent model used car we can purchase, would mean the less often we have to go through this. It's not fun.
