From our home to yours, we wish you a very **MERRY CHRISTMAS!!!** If you are like us, we have already had a few Christmas events that have put us in the spirit of the season, always remembering that "Jesus is the Reason for the Season"! Our home is decorated and ready for the many December events, including a meeting with the General Managers of the Credit Unions, the Lady's Bible Study Christmas Party and many holiday "stop-bys". Here are but a few highlights of our recent months:

In November alone we had 14 house-guests coming from Georgia, Costa Rica, Tennessee, California and El Salvador. When the last of our visitors left, so did Art. He flew to Mexico City to attend an International Character Conference for Latin America. The first part of November brought us Betsy Sprickman (Georgia) and then Pastor Curtis Sharp (Costa Rica). Though their visits were short, we enjoyed every minute with them. The middle of November brought us a team of nine from both Tennessee and California. This team was through All-Blessings-West Coast. In a very short time, we got to know each other and love each other. We cried together, we laughed together as God knit our hearts together. The day following their late night arrival, we had a big day. After briefly getting to know each other over breakfast, we were thrust into the day's events. It started with a tree-planting ceremony in honor of our dear friend and previous team-leader, Ben Keenan. Under the blue skies, the ladies from the Bible Study sang old traditional hymns to bless Roberta, Ben's wife, while the team members lent their loving support. Art shared a special message as we added the lovely Magnolia tree to our garden. In front of it is a beautiful plaque in memory of Ben, "A Faithful Servant of God".

Following the ceremony, we broke bread together in the "Upper Room." We had a time for the team members and the ladies to interact and share from their hearts. Because of the heart-aches and losses some our own team members had experienced, they could relate with the challenges and losses many of the Guatemalans go through on a regular basis. It was well described by one of the team members, *"The Guatemalan people captivated us with their joyful spirits and grateful hearts, despite their poverty levels and heart wrenching experiences of extreme tragedies."* At the same time, the children were gathering together on the soccer field to



celebrate Bret Jr.'s birthday with an inflatable bouncer, pool of balls and various activities. The ladies soon joined the party of over 100 participants. The team not only made the whole event possible, but they

brought special goodie bags for approximately 60 children, as well as many gifts for the families we serve here. The piñata filled their pockets with candy and cake was enjoyed by all. It was a fun time as we used Bret's and Roberta's birthdays (same day) as an excuse to have a party! There was no language barrier. The love of Christ spoke volumes through their warm hugs and cheerful smiles. Amy, a photographer, specialized in taking family photos while her husband, Phil, played "juggler" with the balls. Jackson, Conner and Morgan did what kids do. They played with the kids and had a blast while the other team members found themselves embraced in a hug most of the time.
